PRESENTATION OF THE FESTIVAL

The Quais du Polar international festival is THE unmissable event for aficionados of the noir genre. Having become part of the French, European, and international cultural landscape, it is recognised by professionals from the literary, publishing, and audio-visual industries and by the general public, who turn out in droves to the festival's various events. Since 2005, authors from 60 different countries have been invited.

For the 19th edition of the festival, which will be held from March 31st to April 2nd 2023, more than 120 authors from all over the world will gather in Lyon to meet their readers during conferences, round tables, book signings, concerts, movie screenings and many other literary events in the city. Polar Connection, the festival's professional program, which will be held for the 10th time in 2023, provides international and French professionals time for discussions, inspiring exchanges and to share their experiences, drawing on the effervescence that the festival creates around the crime fiction genre.

In addition, through its international collaborations and projects, Quais du polar works throughout the year to shine a spotlight on francophone crime fiction and its authors all across the world.

In doing so, Quais du polar underlines its commitment to promoting, on a local and international scale, crime and noir literature, a genre that is undeniably alive and growing.

This booklet reflects this approach. It has been elaborated with the support of the French Institute Convention – City and Metropolis of Lyon and distributed in partnership with the international cultural network of the French Institute and the BIEF – Bureau International de l'Édition Française.

As a specific term that has few equivalents abroad, the “polar” encompasses all the diversity of a genre. Detective novels, thrillers, historical investigations, noir novels, and cosy crime are all works of fiction that are more commonly referred to as “polar” in French. With more than 1,300 titles in bookstores in France in 2021, some twenty specialized collections and some 24 million books sold each year (1 in 5 novels), the detective novel remains the favorite literary genre of the French. French-speaking authors, buoyed by this strong success in France, are not, however, systematically translated around the world. While some of these authors are exporting well and in various territories, many authors, testifying to the vitality of French-language crime fiction, have yet to be discovered beyond French borders.

This booklet has been conceived as a tool to be put in the hands of book professionals who wish to be in line with the current state of the French-speaking *polar* genre, in all its diversity. The booklet offers a selection of the latest publications by authors that *Quais du polar* has identified and considers to be important contributors to the *polar* genre. Its purpose is to facilitate access to information regarding the assignment of rights abroad, for translation, and to allow French-speaking authors to be translated and therefore known internationally, in a context of worldwide interest for the genre.

In France, the publication of *polar* has a predominant place in literary publishing, and as previously explained, it includes many types of novels. Faced with such density, classifying it into genres and sub-genres is a necessary step, which we have attempted to take in this booklet - divided into two volumes - which highlights the major trends in current French-language *polars*. Each volume will highlight key themes of the genre and will present “focuses” on categories that revitalize the *polar* genre.

Here are the leads we have followed to better understand the “Francophone crime novel” in this 1st volume of the booklet “French-speaking authors and *polars* to discover”.

The detective novel is a classic of the genre, which has never ceased to attract readers by constantly bringing the figure of the detective back to the forefront. The historical thriller is also a timeless trend, managing to analyze our contemporary society through a crime taking place in a past period. The rural noir, inspired by the American nature writing, is often written far from the city, in the harshness of nature, where men are put to the test and their darkest sides are revealed. The thriller has been thriving thanks to a simple recipe: suspense, twists and plots with many variations.

Furthermore, the *polar* is constantly evolving. In the militant detective novel, always in touch with current events, the authors paint a sharp portrait of our contemporary societies. The cybercrime theme looks at crime from a new angle, developing our relationship with technology. Noir travelers have also become a major part in the French-speaking landscape, with crime moving to a global scale.

The 2nd volume of the booklet “*Polars* and French-speaking authors to discover” will be released in the course of 2023, with the same key themes: detective novels, historical novels, rural noir and thrillers. And other “focuses” which are as follow: news and fiction of the real world, geopolitics and espionage, on the borders of reality and black comedy - cosy crime.

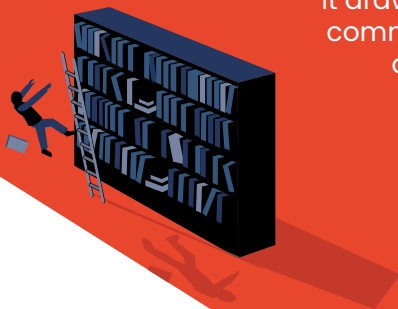

INTRO

THEMES

① DETECTIVE STORY — P.6

The detective story is a staple of the genre. Following a young detective on his first investigation or a corrupt cop, each story offers an insight into the daily life of the police. It draws its inspiration from the professionals themselves. May they be police officers, commissioners, trained squad leaders or in contact with experts, these authors draw on experiences and impressions straight from the field. A profession that is born from passion and which comes with a wealth of unexpected source material.



② HISTORICAL CRIME FICTION — P.11

The historical crime fiction introduces a police investigation set in a specific historical period, with a plot that usually mixes real events and fiction. This genre does not hesitate to take on difficult subjects, such as the Occupation or the Algerian War. However, although the authors use history as their playground, the themes that they tackle are no less current. Each novel is a mirror of our contemporary society, providing keys to understanding it.

④ THRILLER — P.17

The thriller genre, very popular with the general public, places action at the forefront, with plots full of twists and turns that often find an unexpected resolution. Be it psychological, political, fantastic, or judicial, the thriller makes it a point of honor to keep the reader on the edge of his seat until the last page. It is also a place of experimentation for authors who make suspense the raw material of their writing.

③ RURAL NOIR — P.14

Under the impulse of nature writing, the French noir novel has also taken over the great outdoors and the peripheral communities, thus giving a voice to the invisible and forgotten. Rural noir departs from the traditional blueprint where evil is embodied by a killer on the loose and casts nature as an antagonist in its own right, bringing out the darker sides of man in society.

⑤ SOCIAL CRIME NOVEL — P.20

With its success in France, the social crime novel offers an incursion into the contemporary world, its crises and its scandals. Corruption, racism, environmental disasters and police brutality are all themes that authors freely explore. As a form of protest literature, the social crime novel keeps on highlighting social problems and their effects on individuals, as well as the moral and political crises that run through our societies.

⑥ CYBERCRIME — P.23

In the age of the Internet and social networks, crime is taking on a whole new dimension and so is crime fiction. For the past twenty years, cybercrime has become one of the new trends in crime fiction, with concerns about the excesses of new technologies, the dangers of social networks, artificial intelligence... In line with the novel of anticipation, cybercrime fiction portrays the evolution of humanity in contact with technology, for better or for worse.

⑦ NOIR AROUND THE WORLD — P.25

Whether in idyllic destinations or in the depths of the *polar* regions, crime fiction is written around the world. As a strong trend in the genre for more than ten years now, travel is an inexhaustible source for our authors who, acquainted with the landscapes, the society, the culture, the history of a territory, carry the reader away in disorienting investigations/documentaries.

In his slightly bulging Lacoste polo shirt and tweed jacket, fifty-something Paul Menard is a loving husband and father, a devoted and reassuring doctor around whom the Beauce souls of this suburb of Chartres come alive. Until that day in the spring of 97 when his eyes meet those of a beautiful blonde, wearing a tight white dress, who wanders through the village with her 8-year-old daughter. Shortly afterwards, the beautiful girl goes to the doctor's office for migraines. One visit follows another; Paul falls under her spell. Candlelit dinners, timbales of salmon. Camille knows how to live, Camille knows how to love even if her veiled look indicates that she is hiding secrets.

For the beautiful woman is married to a military man who is always on the move around the world. A man who hits her, humiliates her, rapes her with his friends. It is Julie, a family friend, who alerts Paul by repeated calls in the middle of the night. Paul can't live with it anymore, divorces his wife, abandons his patients, and is enraged by his cowardice. How to save the one he loves? On July 13, 1998, the major died. An almost natural death, aided by a few drugs. It was Camille's idea. Paul is convinced that he acted for the greater good, for Camille, for her daughter. So why does Camille suddenly reject him? Why does Paul have this feeling that he may not be the good man he thought he was? Killing a man is no small thing. And did Camille, the sweet victim, really tell him the truth and nothing but the truth? Four years later, the trial opens; Paul's world comes crashing down.

Patricia Delahaie

Patricia Delahaie has a degree in cinema and in social sciences. She was a journalist specializing in parent-child and couple relationships, as well as a panelist on the television program *Les Maternelles* on France 5. She is a keen researcher on self-knowledge and knowledge of others, and has written numerous books on personal development; she is now embarking on a fictional project centered on the news. *La Faussaire* is her first novel.

CINABRE VELVET

"Cinabre" is the color of the fanciest hotel in Toulouse, a velvet vice attended by a wealthy clientele, a mineral red that recalls the color of blood. The Ferdinand Hotel was the scene of a quadruple homicide in the 1980s. Its manager, Eugene Ferdinand, slaughtered his family before being shot by the police. All his family died except for Richard, who decided thirty years later to reopen the establishment. But one does not wash away a dark reputation with monumental renovation work.

Six former classmates founded their independent nursing practice: The Kings of Spades. When one of them disappears after having treated a client of the Ferdinand Hotel, nobody seems to mind at all.

Only Elliot Akerman, a sensitive and uncompromising nurse, goes looking for him. Meanwhile, a killer armed with a sword terrorizes Toulouse. Is he isolated, what is his motive? For Captain Aubert and his team, the investigation is proving to be complex.



Nicolas Druart

Nicolas Druart is a 35-year-old nurse based in Toulouse. He excels at describing the cracks in the mind with surgical precision. *Cinabre* is Druart's 4th novel following *Nuit blanche* (Grand Prix du Suspense psychologique, 2018), *Jeu de dames* (2019), *L'Enclave* (Prix de l'Embouchure, 2021).

Fabrice is a coward. So he goes to the movies with his girlfriend, Juliette, without finding the nerve to tell her what's been preying on him for a while: he doesn't love her any more, and hasn't for quite some time. Maybe he'll find the wherewithal to speak his mind after the movie... But in the theatre, a startling soundtrack superimposes itself on the one that accompanies the romantic comedy they came to see. Thunderous blasts, like the strings of firecrackers you hear on Bastille Day. Moviegoers stand up, then fall back down. Bodies riddled with gunshot wounds. It's a terrorist attack. It lasts a few minutes. It lasts an eternity. When it's finally over, Fabrice is one of the few who stands up. Juliette lies at his feet. He is the widower of a woman he no longer loved.

So begins the aimless wandering of one who survived when so many others died. The one who finds in the female police officer who interrogates him a beam of light he can cling to. A love story like a life drive.

But fate has it in for him, and the police officer disappears. He is Suspect Number One. Laying low for a while would be the thing to do, but Fabrice hasn't got a clue how to go about it. Neither how to hide, nor how to run away. Nor how to rebuild a life that has been blasted to smithereens.

Christophe Molmy

Christophe Molmy is the head of the Paris Research and Intervention Brigade (BRI), a.k.a. the Anti-Gang and Counter-Terrorism Brigade, a unit of the French National Police. His first novel, *Wounded Wolves* (*Les Loups blessés*, Editions de La Martinière, 2015), was selected for four literary awards (the Prix Landerneau, Prix du meilleur polar des lecteurs de Points, Prix du polar de Cognac and the Prix du Goéland Masqué). *After the Day* is his third novel.

A bewitching thriller carried by dense and endearing characters. La Rochelle, July. A woman is found with her throat slit in front of her ten-year-old son, who was spared the gruesome scene with a blindfold and headphones. She is the second victim in three months, and the police have no lead. Police Chief Baccaro calls on Victor Caranne, a prison psychologist and favorite confidante of serial offenders in the Ile de Ré prison. But the killer is an elusive shadow that will soon drive the city into psychosis.

With this second investigation of Victor Caranne, Max Monnehay confirms that she has earned her place among the great masters of the thriller genre.

Max Monnehay was born in 1980 in Beauvais. She is the author of several novels and short stories, including *Corpus Christine*, Prix du premier roman 2006, and *Géographie de la Bêtise*, published in 2012 by Seuil. With *Somb* in 2020, prix Transfuge du meilleur espoir polar, Max Monnehay introduced the investigations of Victor Caranne.

He could have stayed in Paris and made a career there, but he preferred to return "home". Appointed head of the Criminal Group, he is soon faced with a painful case: Betty, the daughter of a modest railway worker, who had gone to return books to the library, has not come home. Her father is convinced that she is dead. So is Schneider. Schneider is a cop, and yet he still can't accept death. Especially that of a 15-year-old girl with the face of a mischievous kitten. He will manage to shed light on this case, but will continue to travel in the land of shadows.

A great dark and tragic novel, served by a brilliant, ironic, harsh and poetic writing, taking the reader on a journey to the end of the night from which they will not come out unscathed.

Hugues Pagan was born in Orléansville (Chlef) in Algeria. After studying philosophy and brief stint in teaching, he joined the police force where he stayed for 25 years. He is now a scriptwriter for television. His previous novel, *Profil perdu*, was a great success with the public and was unanimously acclaimed by the press. As a prize-winning author, Pagan is considered one of the great writers of French crime fiction.

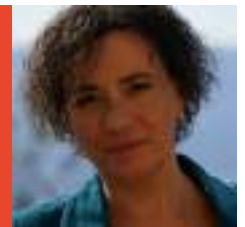

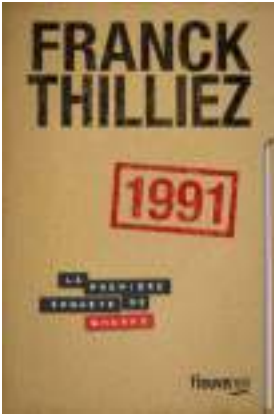

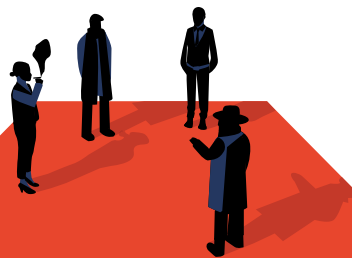

Upon his return from the trenches, Victor Dessange, a former member of the French vice squad, joins the crime squad. The atmosphere in the French capital is electric - between repeated strikes and confrontations between communists and anarchists on the one hand and royalists of the Action française on the other. Illegal immigrants are pouring in from all over the world as colonial empires collapse.

In such a context, the successive murders of several prostitutes hardly appear as priority cases. Until it is no longer a lady of the night, but a client, an official representative of the Republic of China, who is found dead in a brothel. In charge of the investigation, Victor tries to untangle a thread that will lead him from a penal colony for children in Brittany to the attack on a gold convoy in Morocco, where neither the culprits nor the loot have ever been found.

Véronique de Haas has been teaching literature for forty years and has always been passionate about twentieth century history, particularly the period between the wars. *La Muse rouge* won the Prix du Quai des Orfèvres 2022 and has sold over 140,000 copies.

This is 1930s America, the land of prohibition, white supremacy, and destitution that sent millions of starving people on the road, when they weren't stowed away on the underside of a train. The same roads that were paved by the conquerors of the west and now lead to the Pacific. And this horizon, over the shores of California, promising a bright future, is the one of two men, a woman and a child. Milton, the prodigal son who has cut ties with his wealthy family; Arthur, the veteran of the Boer War and the trenches of the Somme, who carries the weight of unforgivable crimes; Pekka, born the day her mother set foot on New York soil and who changes her name every time she wants to change her life; Nathan, finally, the son of the explosion, who has never managed to outrun evil.

These four prodigious destinies intertwine around a single moment that brings them all together: the explosion in Halifax, Nova Scotia, on December 6, 1917, the most terrible devastation caused by man before the nuclear age.

Valentine Imhof

Born in 1970 in Nancy, Valentine Imhof settled in Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon in 2000 where she is a literature teacher. Before that, she lived in the United States and traveled extensively in Scandinavia. She is the author of a biography of Henry Miller, *La Rage d'écrire* (2017), published by Transboréal. She has published two novels at Rouergue: *Par les rafales* (2018, Prix Le Polar se met au vert 2021) and *Zippo* (2019).

L'ÉNIGME DU CODE NOIR

THE CODE NOIR ENIGMA

Never in his long career had Nicolas Le Floch seen such crimes. In the spring of 1791, two bodies were successively found in the Luxembourg district of Paris: the first had a leg and an arm cut off, the second had been flogged to shreds; for good measure, both had been hanged to death. Both of the murdered aristocrats were plantation owners in Santo Domingo.

With his former deputy Bourdeau, Nicolas, a special agent of the monarchy, discovers that these mutilations mimicked the punishments inflicted on runaway slaves by plantation owners in the colonies, according to the stipulations of the black code established by Louis XIV to regulate the repression of misdeeds on the part of slaves in French colonies. Was it a revenge from the islands? Or was it a much more tortuous plot with political intent?

In the revolutionary Paris of 1791, while the Constituent Assembly tries to stabilize the kingdom and Louis XVI defends his crown in the Tuileries Palace, in the face of popular emotions aroused by the most intransigent patriots, the two policemen try to untangle this complex web in a context of confrontations between political factions. In the course of this breathless plot, he will have to understand the battle that is opening up over the abolition of slavery, between the Society of Friends of the Blacks, which advocates for equal rights, and the Massiac Club, which brings together colonial interests in a powerful organization. Above all, he will have to fight the fearsome criminals of the Green Man gang that has taken up residence in the underground quarries of Paris, while overcoming the sentimental imbroglio that opposes Laure de Fitz-James and Aimée d'Arranet, with whom he has a double affair that will put him in an unfortunate position."

Laurent Joffrin

Laurent Joffrin is a French journalist born in 1952. After studying History and Economics at the Sorbonne and Political Science at the Institut d'études politiques in Paris, he obtained a degree in journalism in 1977 and worked at various editorial offices throughout his career, among which the AFP, Libération and Le Nouvel Obs. He has written around fifteen essays and historical and/or political novels. In 2021, with the approval of Jean-François Parot's family, he took over the writing of the *Nicolas Le Floch* series and delivered the fifteenth volume of the series to Buchet Chastel.

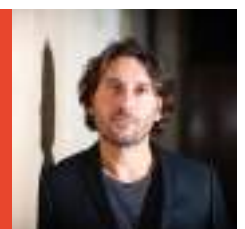

Who killed Henri and Louise Delhomme, this couple of retired farmers, who arrived in the Drôme valley after a long life in the Vercors? A family with no history, a missing child, a region riddled with secrets: Inspector Michel travels the country, from Crest to the Vercors, from Grenoble to Pigalle. He will have to face silence, obstinacy, thirst for redemption and above all the torments of a war that nobody ever wants to mention again.

Born in 1977 in the Lyon region, François Médéline was in charge of studies and research at Sciences Po Lyon during his doctorate, specialized in political sociology and linguistics. He worked in politics for ten years before becoming a writer.

In *Pas de littérature*, Sébastien Rutés pays tribute to the Série Noire and features a translator of Gallimard's iconic crime fiction imprint in a frantic chase, worthy of the best American hardboiled fiction and of its most brilliant production in terms of literature and of reflection on literature itself.

April 1950. Gringoire Centon is a translator for the Série Noire. Terrible at English, his wife secretly translates the texts for him, and he merely rewrites them in a slang that he picks up in the disreputable Paris bistros where he ventures every evening with a notebook and a pencil. One particular evening, he meets a so-called former GI in a bar, who embarks him on a wild story of well-read crooks and counterfeiters, against the backdrop of a feud between various Mafiosi.

As the first deliveries of the Marshall Plan aid are landing, and, in Marseille, the strike of communist dockers is broken by the CIA who joined forces with the local mob, Gringoire Centon ends up being the mediator of cultural tensions linked to the Cold War, and becomes the unwitting interpreter of this new equivocal world, while still relying on literature for guidance.

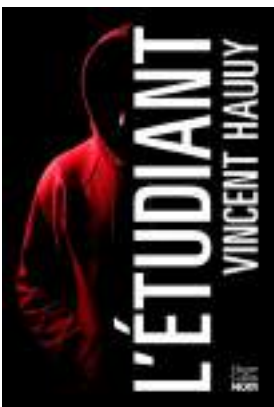

To distinguish between the true and the false and to survive Morguélen, she will have to escape this new Dance of the Furies and understand that she is only a piece on a giant chessboard...

This new novel by Nicolas Lebel is a game of mirrors on a dead-end street. It takes the reader on a wild ride where everything is just shadows and reflections. The author of *the Mehrlicht* and *Le Gibier* series has an unparalleled sense of humor and ingenuity.

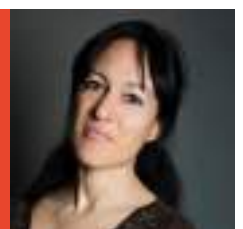
Since he was fired from his packaging plant, Philippe is bored stiff, and spends his days waiting for Lucas, his 16-year-old son, and his wife Maud to return from work. Only his Sunday dinners with friends, hunting, and the prospect to pass on its pleasures to his son, break the monotony. Until the day Julien shows up, the neighbour from Paris who has come here to hole up in the house opposite. Then, Philippe's life is turned upside down. He starts spying on his neighbour, who fascinates him to the point of obsession, and tries to get him accepted by his intimate circle, who finds him suspicious.

In this no-frills account, Philippe addresses his nephew, and reveals to the reader the relentless chain of events, which set the tragedy in motion. The extreme tension conveyed in the text is all the more tangible thanks to the calm

and collected tone of the narrator, who simply speaks of his admiration for his new neighbour, for his wife, and the happiness of establishing strong bonds with his son. There is also the fatalistic attitude of the one who has accepted being no more than the spectator of his own life.

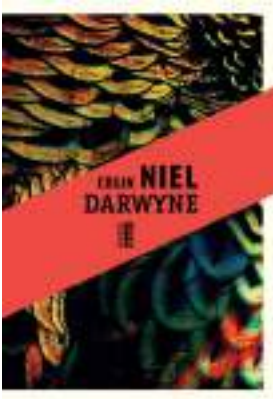

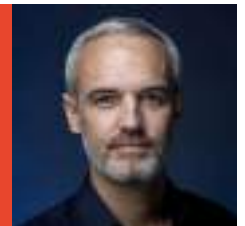

She can only count on the unfailing optimism of her best (and only) friend, the very plump Grace, and on her own brother George, who has overcome the trauma inflicted by his father by founding a poor but united family.

When a wealthy candidate for judicial office entrusts her with her 17-year-old stepdaughter Clara, who has been mute since witnessing her friend's murder, Cassandra doesn't think twice about taking on her case... without suspecting that she will have to go far beyond the framework of therapy to help her patient. Even though Clara is able to speak again, she systematically avoids talking about what happened to Charlotte, her friend and au pair who was taking care of her two brothers...

And it soon becomes clear that the beautiful dead girl made quite the impression on the men around her, who are all potential suspects. With aplomb, Cassandra sets about questioning all the entourage of the two teenagers to shed light on the situation. But her sense of ethics is put to the test, faced with a stepmother who secretly abuses Clara, the seductive inspector Al Saoud who's after her secrets, and the disturbing attitude of her patient herself... Will saving Clara allow Cassandra to get her own shipwrecked life back on track?

What does this serial killer look like? Like a regular citizen of Clermont? Or one of those yellow vests protestors? Or like Simon himself? To confound the killer, Simon must return to his former hunting grounds. But at what price?

Pierre Marlot is observing a colony of avocets in the Somme Bay when he receives a call from the French consul in Uganda. No one has heard from his daughter Anne, a promising and fiercely independent journalist, since she left for the eastern part of the Democratic Republic of Congo to do a report. When he arrives in Kampala, Pierre understands that he should not expect anything from the consular services. He embarks on a solitary quest to find his daughter. This is how he meets Juliet Ochola, a journalist working for a major Ugandan newspaper. Juliet decides to take over Anne's work. In a country where journalists face death threats and arbitrary arrests, she embarks on a high-risk investigation, even as a student uprising sets the capital on fire.

This is a fascinating investigation into blood minerals that keeps the reader on the edge of his seat from the first page to the last. In his first novel, Max Izambard takes us to the heart of an Africa of the Great Lakes that is starving for justice. In a labyrinth of questions and pretense, his magnificent characters struggle to bring out disturbing truths in the face of a desperate power.

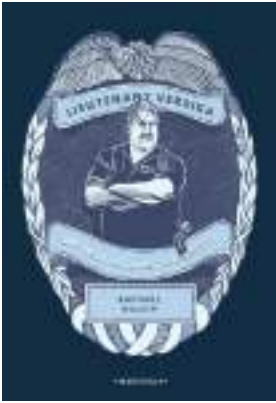
